Ballot Drop Boxes

Open ballot drop boxes are listed on your ballot. All ballot drop boxes close promptly at 8:00pm on Election Day, April 25th.

Mail

Ballots returned by postal mail must be post marked no later than Election Day, April 25th to be counted. No postage is required to return your ballot via US Postal Service. We recommend mailing your ballot no later than April 21st.

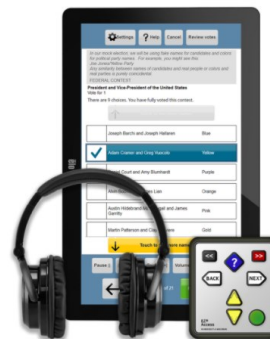
Accessibility Information

Fire Protection District No. 3 Emergency Medical Services Regular Property Levy

The Board of Commissioners for Mason County Fire Protection District No. 3 adopted Resolution No. 2023.001, concerning a proposition to renew a regular property tax levy. This proposition renews a regular property tax levy, for the provisions of emergency medical services pursuant to RCW 84.52.069 in the amount of \$0.45 or less per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for a period of six consecutive years to be collected beginning in 2024.

Explanatory Statement

The current six-year Emergency Medical Services Levy for Mason County Fire District No. 3 expires in 2023. This measure renews the six-year Emergency Medical Services Levy for six consecutive years. Funds raised by this EMS levy will only be used to provide emergency medical services, including related personnel costs, training for such personnel, and related equipment, supplies, vehicles, and structures needed for the provision of emergency medical services. The levy amount will be established at the rate of \$0.45 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. Voter approval of Proposition No. 1 will provide funding for the District to continue to provide emergency medical services at current levels.
